Intelligent Energy - Europe: the power to innovate

There are many untapped opportunities to save energy and encourage the use of renewable energy sources in Europe, but market conditions are not always helping. The Intelligent Energy - Europe (IEE) programme is the EU's tool for funding action to improve these conditions and move us towards a more energy intelligent Europe.

To date, 400+ European projects, 60 local/regional energy agencies and 60

large-scale events have been supported by the programme.

The IEE programme is a part of the €3.6 billion Competitiveness and Innovation Framework Programme, which will run from 2007 to 2013.

Altogether, €730 million are available to fund projects for the promotion of energy efficiency and renewable energy.

The 2008 call for proposals: up to 75% funding for your intelligent energy projects

The 2008 call for proposals will be published in late February 2008.

Some € 50 million will be available to cofinance projects for the promotion of energy efficiency and renewables, and the setting up of local or regional energy agencies.

Successful applicants can expect to receive financial support covering up to 75% of the eligible costs.



The European Info Day: essential information and a platform for exchange

Applying for Intelligent Energy - Europe funding is a competitive process, and only the best project proposals will be selected for funding. The European Info Day 2008 will give you essential information and

advice on how to develop a good project proposal and apply successfully. It also offers the chance to find project partners from across Europe.

Who should attend?

Anyone who wants to set up a project and apply for funding. More than 400 participants are expected, including local, regional and national authorities, private companies, European and national trade

associations, non-governmental organisations, European institutions, current IEE project partners, and future applicants.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Getting there

The IEE European Info Day 2008 takes place in the Charlemagne Building of the European Commission, Rue de la Loi 170, Brussels.

- From the Airport: A convenient and cheap way of getting to the venue is to take the N° 12 'Airport Express' Bus. Get off at 'Schuman'.
 Alternatively you can take the train to Brussels, where you have to get off at 'Gare Central' to take the Metro to 'Schuman'.
 - Finally, you can take a taxi. Yet, this costs approximately €25 one way.
- By Metro: Take Line 1A or 1B and get off at 'Schuman"
- By regional train: The train station 'Schuman' is close to the venue.
- By local bus: Lines 11, 21, 28, 36 (Stop 'Schuman')
